The book <u>Scorpions by Walter Dean Myers</u> supports the statement that, "In this world goodness is destined to be defeated." I've heard it said that, "When under a strong force, it is only a matter of time before deeply influenced or overtaken by that force." I believe that this book supports both statements. Myers shows the negativity of the streets, and how it affected two young males who were once not familiar to the streets, to the streets turning into killers themselves. The quote is implying that evil will prevail against goodness. In this paper, I will show how evil prevailed in Tito's, Jamal's, and Mama's circumstances.

The book <u>Scorpions</u> shows Jamal, as he gradually becomes a bad person. In the beginning of the book, Jamal shows concern for the well being of his mother.
